Making a New Year’s Resolution? Lose the Weight of Debt

“Out with the old; in with the new”! Many of us will begin the task of tackling a New Year’s resolution. Choosing to lose weight is a very popular goal. This year why not lose the weight of debt? Carrying debt month to month even year to year can be just as hazardous to your health as carrying excess pounds. The first step to getting out of debt is

creating a budget. A budget is a financial tool used to plan spending and saving. Start by writing your monthly income down then write down your monthly expenses. Fixed expenses are rent, insurance, day care, or loans. Flexible expenses include gas/ transportation, electricity, personal expenses.

Mentoring Children of Incarcerated Parents Program Kicks Off in January!

OUR YOUTH NEED YOU!!!

Our children need you!

Thousands of children suffer traumatic and extended separations from their parents on account of parental incarceration. Statistics from the U.S. Department of Justice Bureau of Justice Statistics state:

- 1 in every 142 U.S. residents was incarcerated
- Over 2 million U.S. children have had an incarcerated parent on any single day
- 1 in 32 adults in the U.S. is under some form of correctional supervision (probation, parole, jail or prison).
- Over 7 million children under the age of 18 have a parent under correctional supervision.

Through mentoring it is our hope that positive youth development will occur. All youth need support guidance and opportunities. With this support youth can develop self-confidence in four areas that are key to create a healthy, happy, successful life, and reduce the odds of being incarcerated themselves.

These areas are competence, usefulness, belonging, and power.

Won't you consider becoming a mentor?

What would be required of you?

- At least 21 years of age
- Pass a background check
- Attend mentor and family strengthening training
- Participate in weekly phone contact with mentee
- Participate in at least one individual contact per month with mentee

Who are the youth in our mentorship program?

- Age 4-17
- Live in the 21216 zip code area
- Has a parent incarcerated in state or federal prison

How will CHCDC assist you in your mentorship? We will:

- Schedule monthly group activities
- Facilitate individual meetings with mentors and mentees

First Place Winner of a \$100 Home Depot Gift Certificate was 1602 N. Bentalou Street.

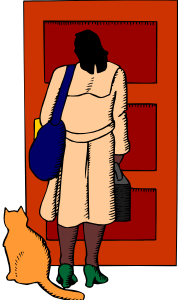
Second Place Winner of a \$50 Home Depot Gift Certificate was 1639 Ruxton Avenue

January Brings New President and New Director of Public Safety to Coppin State University

January 14, 2008 is the start date for **Dr. Reginald S. Avery** who will serve at the fifth President of Coppin State University (CSU). Avery is currently executive vice chancellor for academic affairs at the University of South Carolina Upstate, part of the University of South Carolina system.

In service to the greater higher education community, Avery is a member of the Advisory Committee on Academic Programs for South Carolina's Commission on Higher Education and is an institutional representative of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Very active in his community, Avery serves on several boards, including those of the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce, Spartanburg Housing Authority, Urban League of the Upstate, and Community Advisory Board of BMW Automotive.

Avery holds a Ph.D. from the Florence Heller School of Social Policy and Management at Brandeis University, an M.S.W. from the George Williams College of Aurora University, and a B.S. in sociology from North Carolina A&T State University. He and his wife Esther have three adult children and two grandchildren.

On December 20, Coppin State University Interim President Dr. Sadie R. Gregory announced that former Baltimore City Police Commissioner **Leonard D. Hamm** will join Coppin State University as its new Director of Public Safety on January 2, 2008.

"Coppin State University is ecstatic to be bringing aboard Leonard Hamm," said Dr. Gregory. "His impressive credentials include over three decades of law enforcement experience in Baltimore City, which is the region

that Coppin primarily serves. During his policing career, Mr. Hamm has also served in several leadership positions."

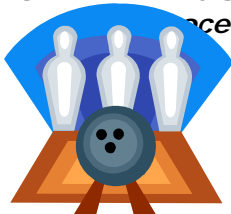
A native of Baltimore, Hamm grew up in Cherry Hill. He joined the city's police force in 1974. He is a graduate of City College High School, and graduated from the Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science. In addition to serving as Police Commissioner, Hamm also served as a patrol officer, held posts on the SWAT team, in criminal intelligence, and at the police academy while a member of the city's police force. Hamm, who has also served as a Deputy Commissioner, holds the distinction of being the first African-American Commander of the police department's Central District.

Hamm and his wife Rose, who is a graduate of Coppin and a city educator, reside in Baltimore.
