New Programs at Coppin Heights CDC!!

Through the support of dedicated community residents and the Baltimore Community Foundation, Coppin Heights Community Development Corporation (CHCDC) has launched a block-by-block blight project.

The blight battle – which has attracted the attention of the Barack Obama campaign camp -- and other CHCDC efforts, past and upcoming, are vital parts of a bigger war, explains Michelle

McEachern, CHCDC's Executive Director.

As McEachern describes it, CHCDC is out to "revitalize" the whole neighborhood surrounding Coppin as the university continues its "historical" community outreach commitment. "The university has its overall role, our job is to work at the grassroots level," she says.

New programs starting at CHCDC in October include:

- Healthy Neighborhoods – a homeownership and community investment program
- Roadmap to Financial Freedom – a financial literacy program targeting residents 16 and older
- Stoppin' Lead In Coppin – a joint community outreach and education project between CHCDC, the Coalition to End Childhood Lead Poisoning and Coppin State University.

Healthy Neighborhoods Comes to Coppin Heights

Healthy Neighborhoods helps strong but undervalued Baltimore neighborhoods increase home values, market their communities, create high standards for property improvements, and forge strong connections among neighbors.

Healthy Neighborhoods offers:

- innovative below market **financing** for acquisitions/rehabilitations and home improvement,

- **professional advice**, including housing counseling and free architectural advice for rehabbers

- **grants** for marketing and community projects that build a positive image.

Healthy Neighborhoods offers low-interest purchase/renovation loans for houses on our Target Blocks. You can do anything you want from landscaping to remodeling the kitchen to installing central air, and everything

in between.

New Housing and Support Coming to North Avenue



CHCDC, Coppin State University, and others partner to revitalize North Avenue to attract for New Homeowners

Through the generous support of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Historically Black Colleges and Universities Program, Coppin State University will provide economic assistance to CHCDC to carry out neighborhood revitalization in Greater Coppin Heights/Rosemont and to further strengthen its relationship, involvement, and effectiveness in

addressing community needs. A major CHCDC activity under the project is to develop three new homes for first-time, low-income homebuyers; providing direct economic assistance for home (façade) improvements to 14 low- to moderate-income owners of occupied properties adjacent to the proposed new homes, to ensure that current residents' properties are made

aesthetically comparable to the newly developed homes. In addition to CSU, key project partners include the Baltimore City Department of Housing and Community Development, Ash-Co-East/Coppin Heights Association, W.L. Blair Development, Rosemont Neighborhood Improvement Association, and Neighborhood Housing Services of Baltimore.

Road Map to Financial Freedom

Using curriculum from the Family Economics & Financial Education (FEFE) Project of the University of Arizona, the Road Map to Financial Freedom (RMFF) provides residents in the Greater Coppin Heights/Rosemont Community with the skills and training necessary to manage their money, make sound financial decisions, and decrease their debt. RMFF

provides a feasible strategy for combating the rising rates of evictions and foreclosures in the community. In addition to combating the rise in evictions and foreclosures in the community, through RMFF, residents learn about the disadvantages of using alternative financial services (e.g., check cashing centers, payday loans). Residents are assisted in opening

checking and savings accounts at mainstream financial institutions. RMFF provides one-on-one financial counseling to low-income adults as well as financial literacy training to residents 16 and older.

MTA Changing Route for Bus #16

The MTA will hold public hearings to present proposals to change several bus routes including Bus #16 (Mondawmin-Brooklyn Homes). The proposed change will eliminate service through south of North Avenue on Warwick and all service on Bentalou and Whitmore Avenue. From Mondawmin, under the new route, the bus will make a right onto North Avenue from Warwick and head west until Bloomingdale. The bus will turn left onto Bloomingdale and right

onto Poplar Grove. From there it will turn right onto Edmondson Avenue. The new route eliminates most service to Coppin Heights and Rosemont.

It is not too late to save our bus service. Plan to attend one of the following public hearings to make your concerns known:

Stoppin Lead In Coppin

The Coalition to End Childhood Lead Poisoning (CECLP), in partnership with CHCDC, Coppin State University, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will launch a one-year, intensive outreach campaign targeted to the Coppin Heights and Rosemont Communities called *Stoppin Lead In Coppin*.

Last year, 1 in 5 children tested for lead in the 21216 zip code had an elevated blood lead level. *Stoppin Lead in Coppin* seeks to implement community awareness,

education, and services to make the community's housing environment safer for families.

Under the leadership of CHCDC staff and a CECLP Program Coordinator, Coppin State University students will conduct door-to-door education and home assessments in the Greater Coppin Heights/Rosemont Community and connect residents with health and legal services.

Community events and trainings will also be

conducted. Through the Coalition's HUD-funded Operation LEAP Baltimore project, residents in Coppin Heights can access window replacement and other housing related services through CHCDC.
