Maryland's Homestead Tax Credit

If you own residential property in the State of Maryland as your principal residence, you're entitled to the Homestead Tax Credit. The credit saves you money because it limits the amount of your property tax assessment—lowering your property taxes. To be eligible, your home must be your principal residence and not a vacation or rental property, which wouldn't qualify for the credit.

In past years, it's likely that you've already received the credit. **Beginning this year, you'll now need to file a one-time application before April 1 to continue to receive the credit.** If you're a property owner *not* currently receiving the credit, you should also apply now in the event that you become eligible in the future.

To apply: Go to www.dat.state.md.us to submit your application online directly to Maryland's Department of Assessments and Taxation, or fill out the application that was mailed to you with your January 2008 assessment notice.

FREE A HEPA VACUUM WILL REDUCE THE LEAD AND OTHER HOMEBASED ALLERGENS IN YOUR HOME

Courtesy of the Coalition to End Childhood Lead Poisoning and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), we now have vacuums with HEPA (High Efficiency Particulate Air) filters which can remove 99.97% of airborne particles.

These vacuums are excellent for homes with small children, pregnant women, and people with Asthma.

Homesaver Refinance Mortgage Program

The Community Development Administration's (CDA) Homesaver Refinance Mortgage program provides a refinancing option to Marylanders who have sub-prime or exotic mortgages and are experiencing difficulties as a result of mortgage default, low credit scores, and/or a mortgage greater than the current value of their home.

Applicants need only a minimum credit score of 550 to qualify for fixed 30-year and 40-year amortizing loans as low as 6.25% interest rates.

The school is targeting economically challenged children living in Baltimore City. The median family income for current students is \$28,000 per year.
