

## **Tiffany L. Gary, PhD, MHS**

Tiffany L. Gary, PhD, MHS - is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Epidemiology at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. She holds a joint appointment in the Division of General Internal Medicine in the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. Dr. Gary has a master's and doctoral degree in clinical epidemiology from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, and has experience in epidemiological research, clinical trial design and conduct, and medical claims data analysis, mostly in the disease area of diabetes. She also has experience in applied epidemiology through working for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Dr. Gary has a particular dedication toward improving the health of ethnic minorities and focuses her professional work around issues of minority health and social/environmental determinants of chronic disease. She's conducted community-based research in African Americans with type 2 diabetes for the past 9 years. Her independent research program includes funding from several federal agencies including funding mechanisms geared toward increasing minority researchers in biomedical research. She's participated in teaching efforts in the African-American community by teaching an Introduction to Epidemiology course at Tougaloo College, A Historically Black College located in Jackson, Mississippi for 5 summers. Dr. Gary has also been a leader with respect to diversity efforts within her department/school by chairing a task force on student diversity, and participating on several School-wide advisory boards and scholarship committees.
