Quick dorm Recipe:
Simple Microwave Salmon
Ingredients

- 2 salmon fillets
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1/4 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons honey

Directions

Place salmon in a small microwave safe dish. Combine remaining ingredients in a small bowl; spoon over salmon. Cover and cook on MED (50%) power in microwave 2 to 3 minutes, in 1-minute intervals or until done.
