KHEAA Verify

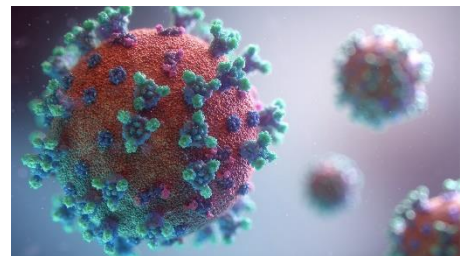
Each year, the U.S. Department of Education selects a percentage of financial aid applicants for a review of their financial aid information. This review is known as verification and will require certain information to be submitted in order for the financial aid process to be completed.

Coppin State University has partnered with KHEAA to provide an online verification process for financial aid processing called KHEAAVerify. Students and parents can sign in and complete the online process at www.kheaaverify.com/coppin or contact KHEAA by telephone at 1-855-272-8771 or by email at verification@kheaa.com.

The verification process is not optional and must be completed before any financial aid awards will be offered. The failure to submit verification documentation may delay disbursements.

Quarantine Cookin'

BLT Skillet

Cook linguine according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a large skillet, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp. Remove to paper towels; drain, reserving 1 teaspoon drippings.

In the drippings, saute tomato and garlic for 1-2 minutes or until heated through. Stir in the bacon, lemon juice, salt and pepper. Drain linguine; add to the skillet. Sprinkle with cheese and parsley; toss to coat.

Ingredients:

- 4 ounces uncooked whole wheat linguine
- 4 bacon strips, cut into 1-1/2-inch pieces
- 1 plum tomato, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1-1/2 teaspoons lemon juice
