

RCP PROGRAM OUTCOMES



The Rehabilitation Counseling Program (RCP) at Coppin State University is a fully accredited program by the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) www.core-rehab.org. In January of 2012, the RCP completed its five-year internal program evaluation and successfully completed the evaluation without conditions. The internal evaluation takes place on a five-year cycle and will be evaluated again in 2017.

The RCP offers the Masters in Rehabilitation Counseling and the Post-Masters in Professional Counselor Licensure. For students interested in applying to the RCP, the deadlines for submission of all credentials are May 15 for the fall semester, and October 15 for the spring semester. The program admits an average of 15 students in both the fall and spring semesters.

At this time the RCP has a total of 83 students. The program has four full-time faculty and 17 very committed, dedicated, and credentialed part-time faculty who teach the courses within the CORE accredited curriculum. The instructor to student ratio in the RCP is 1:12. For the Internship and Practicum courses the ratio is 1:5. Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA each semester to remain in good academic status.

Graduates from the RCP for Spring 2014 – Fall 2014 is a total of 25 students. Over the past three years 55 students graduated from the program. Within the first six months of graduation 95% of the RCP graduates report successful employment.

100% of the students are from underrepresented groups including persons with disabilities. The program has a Rehabilitation Service Administration training grant that provides scholarships to support students with meeting the costs associated with tuition and fees. The scholarship is scheduled to end in 2015. The RCP plans to pursue refunding as the opportunity becomes available.
