Overview

The Helene Fuld School of Nursing (HFSON) is an integral component of the College of Health Professions (CHP). Within the HFSON Undergraduate Program there are three (3) Plans of Study: Traditional, Accelerated Second Degree and RN to BSN Completion. According to the AACN Fact Sheet titled, "Accelerated Baccalaureate and Master's Degree in Nursing" (2011), the United States Department of Labor has projected the need for more than one million new and replacement registered nurses by 2018. With our Traditional, Upper Level BSN plan of study, the HFSON has prepared to assist with meeting the nursing workforce need.

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 on 4.0 scale
- Official transcripts from each college attended prior to CSU and CHP HFSON

 200 level+ English course, College
 Algebra, Basic Statistics, Anatomy
 and Physiology I and II, Chemistry,
 Microbiology, Sociology, Speech,
 Philosophy, Psychology,
 Developmental Psychology,
 History I & II, Nutrition *,
 Pathophysiology* and Nursing as a
 Profession*. Prerequisite Science
 courses will be accepted in
 accordance with CSU requirements.
- Official competitive scores from the Test of Essential Academic Skills V (TEAS V) entrance examination.
- Three (3) Letters of Recommendation
- Test of English as a Foreign
 Language (TOEFL) International
 applicants whose native language
 is not English are required to earn
 a minimum score of 500 on the
 Test of English as a Foreign
 Language (TOEFL) and at least 173
 on computerized TOEFL.

includes the submission of the following: application to CSU, application to CHP HFSON, transcripts to CSU and CHP HFSON, letters of recommendation to CHP HFSON and achieving a competitive score on the TEAS V. The Early Decision Application Deadline is December 1st and the Final Application Deadline is February 1st. If admitted, evidence of Clinical Clearance including Health History, Immunizations, CPR, Background Check and onsite Urine Drug Screening is required by July 1st.
