APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Complete the application form included in the RN to BSN Information Packet or https://www.coppin.edu/apply. The application process includes the submission of the following: application to CSU, application to CHP HFSON, transcripts to CSU, transcripts to CHP HFSON, and letters of recommendation. If admitted, evidence of Clinical Clearance including Health History, Immunizations, CPR, Background Check and onsite Urine Drug Screening are required.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Admission to CSU, CHP, and HFSON (apply by deadline)
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 on 4.0 scale to apply*
- Official transcripts from each college attended prior to CSU and CHP HFSON Pre-Requisite Courses English Composition I & II, World Lit or 200 level English course, College Algebra, Basic Statistics, Anatomy and Physiology I and II, Chemistry, Microbiology, Sociology, Speech, Intro to Philosophy or Logic, General Psychology, Developmental Psychology, History I & II, Nutrition*, Pathophysiology* and Nursing as a Profession**. Prerequisite Science courses will be accepted in accordance with CSU requirements.
- Three (3) Letters of Recommendation
- RN License
- Resume

- **course may be taken in Fall, Spring, or Summer before program begins.

Each student must earn a minimum of 120 or more credits to graduate with a baccalaureate degree.
